BENY-SUR-MER CANADIAN WAR CEMETERY, REVIERS, FRANCE



The cemetery contains 2,048 Second World War burials, the majority Canadian, and 19 of them unidentified.

CORIANO RIDGE WAR CEMETERY, RICCIONE, ITALY



The cemetery contains 1,939 Second World War Commonwealth burials of the 1st British and 5th Canadian Armoured Divisions.
